



Understanding more about veneers

Planning to have porcelain veneers fitted?

What to expect from your upcoming appointments

When you need a way to whiten your teeth or conceal gaps, having dental veneers can solve both issues quickly, and without causing any discomfort.

Custom-fitted to your teeth, veneers are porcelain coverings that also help to protect your teeth against sensitivity and further staining. With the correct care, they can last up to 15 years or more. All with no pain and no drilling!

But what is involved with having veneers fitted? Are there any injections or uncomfortable appointments to sit through?

Initial consultation

This will involve our dentist understanding your needs and taking some photos a 3D scan of your teeth.

You and our dentist can use this initial consultation to discuss your veneers in more depth, allowing them to answer any concerns or questions you may have about the procedure. During this appointment, our dentist will explain the estimated costs and time required.

Test drive!

Your second appointment usually occurs within seven days of the initial consultation. Our dentist will use Digital Smile Design to show you a computer-generated view how your new smile will look once the veneers are fitted. This is why we like to call this stage 'The Test Drive'. If you want to make changes, we can update the digital smile there and then.

If you are happy to go ahead, we will give the green light to our laboratory to make the veneers. If you want anything changed, we can do that too!

Third visit

At this stage, we fit the veneers. This may require some minor sanding down at the front of your mouth to enable the veneers to attach smoothly. Don't worry, we'll make sure you're numb, so you don't feel a thing!

We use dental cement to attach the veneers securely. This can take up to an hour, but once fitted, you can go about your day as normal sporting beautiful looking teeth.

It's that simple!
